"Do YOU Know What You Have Done?"

While on my annual pastoral retreat in Maine recently, I asked the above question to the counselors at Moose River Outpost. They were wrapping up a record-breaking Summer of 900 campers, looking back on what they had "accomplished". For the most

part, their response was all about a list of "tasks completed".

I shifted their focus however, to have them recall whether they went above and beyond to make a life-changing impact on individual campers.

I told them the story of an older woman at the church in Sunbury, who led me to a dark corner of the basement of the church to witness to me what was important to her...how, many years ago, when she was 10 years old in VBS, there was a teacher who shared her faith and led the young girl to confess and accept Christ as her savior. This woman did not remember the crafts, the food the music or the theme of the VBS that year. She remembered the love of Christ shown to her by a teacher who was willing to step out of the "program," and show her the face of Christ personally.

So with that in mind, I ask the people of this church, "DO YOU KNOW WHAT YOU HAVE DONE?" ...and in line with that question and all of our responses, what should WE ALL be doing differently?

In prayer on that same retreat, God opened a neat opportunity for our church to impact the families of this community which I would like you all to consider as we approach the Advent season. Psalm 116:14 says that we are to "show the Lord our loyalty by fulfilling our vows to him in front of His people."

I believe that we are in a season of being tested by God and by His followers... i.e. will we accept all the current challenges and step up to the plate? We need to pray that we are up to the task.

Let us focus on the kinds of things we can do to get the families of this community to take the chance to be "all in".

- 1 Peter 5:1-11 says we are to be examples to the flock, not because we must but because we are willing. Charles Haddon Spurgeon summed it up by saying that "Shepherds are to lead, feed, and give heed."
- 1 John 4:12 reminds us that we should always keep in mind that God's love is brought to full expression in us.

Here is the concept, which in excitement, I have already shared with the Ministry Council and the Class Leaders:

Advent Project Proposal:

The idea is to move families in the neighborhood to participation in the Church Advent Season for the good of their children. I believe that the parents and grandparents of this community for the most part, were exposed to the beautiful story of our Savior's birth at one time or another, but for whatever reason, they are not choosing to expose their kids to it.

You hear this: "I thought we would wait for them to make up their own minds when they get older." This is very dangerous thinking but if you look at the trends listed in the annual report of the **Barna Group** (see me if you would like a copy), you see that it is part of the world-wide malaise in the church.

The concept is that teams of two would visit houses that we know have kids. To identify recipients of a visit, we would send flyers to the elementary school and use the list of families that we have collected from Blast, VBS, and Community Day. At the visit, we would ask the parents if they ever heard the story, and then ask if they will commit to helping their kids hear the story.

If they are interested, we will ask them to do two things during Advent: share a daily advent calendar which we will give them for each child in the house with scriptures and candy for the child, and ask them to commit to attending so they can hear the prophecy and its fulfillment on the Sundays of Advent...of course culminating in their attendance at the Christmas Eve service.

This is the perfect excuse and opportunity to impress on this community how badly God is needed. So far we have been looking for that type of Advent calendar and we have found them at \$1.49 each, including a story book, and calendar with 25 Days of Scripture verses, telling the story.

I strongly urge all of us to get on board both from a financial and participation standpoint. If you know of a family in your neighborhood with young children, that would be a good place to start. Maybe even your own family would be a good place to start! Lift it up in prayer and see where the Holy Spirit will lead you to participate!



Austin Carpenter completed the requirements and obtained the rank of Eagle Scout on September 13, 2019 following a Board of Review. Austin's project benefited the Homeward Bound Animal Rescue. Homeward Bound focuses on rescuing moms and their pups.

Austin raised enough money to purchase four outdoor kennels and three play yards. In addition, he collected over 600 items for donation to the rescue including towels, blankets, dog toys, treats and cleaning supplies. He had an information table at several local pet stores where he had display boards and handouts educating the public on various aspects of getting a pet from a rescue.

Austin will have his Eagle ceremony later this year. Austin is a graduate of CD East Class of 2019 and is attending Keystone College studying Wildlife Biology. His grandmother Jill was a den leader for several years and his mom, Meghan, has served Pack and Troop 308 in various leadership roles for the past 11 years.

Once again, Trinity is participating in "Operation Christmas Child". Below is a list of items recommended for boys & girls ages 2-4, 5-9, & 10-14. Bins marked "Operation Christmas Child" will be in the Narthex and

downstairs for your items/boxes. If you would like to fill a "Operation Christmas Child" box yourself, there are some available in the Narthex and downstairs for you to take home, fill, and return. Large empty shoe boxes are also needed and can be placed in the bins. If you would like to donate money for supplies, or for shipping, the cost to ship each Christmas Box is \$9.00. Items are due by Sunday, November 10, 2019.

Personal care items: comb, hairbrush, hairbands, barrettes, toothbrush (NO TOOTHPASTE), wash cloth & bar soap, adhesive bandages (kids like colorful ones), chapstick (NO LIPGLOSS). **For older kids**: nail clippers & files, stick deodorant.

School supplies-pencils: small pencil sharpeners, colored pencils, pencil case, pens, markers (NOT PERMANENT), crayons, coloring books, water color set & brush, chalk, blank index cards, pads, tablets- lined & unlined, composition books, notebooks, glue sticks, stickers, scissors, rulers.

Items for 10 to 14-year olds: sewing kit containing 1 to 2 yards of material, pins, needles, thread, & ribbon, small tool kits containing screwdrivers, hammer, screws, nails - NO SAWS-POCKETKNIVES, T-shirts, socks, gloves, bandanas.

Toys: foam ball, tennis ball, finger puppets, slinky, cars & trucks, dinosaurs, animals, action figures, playdoh (cookie cutters), jump rope, small frisbee, yo-yo, playing cards, jewelry, small purse, compact mirror.

Every box should have a WOW! Item such as a doll, musical instrument, jewelry, solar powered calculator, baseball & mitt, football, soccer ball, or kickball with pump.
